Partial sun or partial shade loving annuals prefer 4 to 6 hours of sun per day and are happiest getting their sun mostly in the morning and/or evening with shade through the middle of the day



Bacopa - tiny white flowers on a dainty mounding vine

Begonia, Wax - compact mounds of green-bronze foliage and non-stop blooms

Coleus - mottled colors often change in intensity depending on amount of sunlight and heat

Euphorbia - clouds of airy white flowers make this a great filler plant

Impatiens, New Guinea - large, showy blooms provide hard-to-find brilliant color and contrast in the shade

Sweet Potato Vine - dense, rapidly growing, trailing vine with a variety of foliage colors

If a plant is labeled **partial sun**, the emphasis is making sure the plant gets at least 4 hours of sun per day. If a plant is labeled **partial shade**, then greater emphasis is placed on the plant not getting more than 6 hours of direct sun per day.
